

Jewish Summer Adventures



It's summer and time for my annual article suggesting great Jewish adventures for you and your family.

Close to home, the Center for Jewish History *Rabbi Hecht* (www.cjh.org) at 15 West 16th Street in Manhattan (between 5th and 6th Avenues) is presenting **By Dawn's Early Light: Jewish Contributions**

to American Culture from the Nation's Founding to the Civil War. Here is a chance to learn about many historical achievements by Jews in America that you won't read about in school textbooks.

Until August 3rd, the Center also has an exhibit called Modeling the Synagogue: From Dura to Touro. In 1973, Yeshiva University Museum commissioned ten scale models of historic synagogues from around the world, including ancient synagogues like Dura-Europos (3rd Century Syria) and Beit Alpha (6th Century Galilee), and modern ones like the Touro Synagogue (18th Century Newport) and



Tempio Israelitico (19th Century Florence). Seven of the Yeshiva University models in this exhibit are together for the first time in two decades.

A bit further away in Philadelphia, the National Museum of American Jewish History (www.nmajh.org) has a wonder-



ful exhibit entitled Chasing Dreams: Baseball & Becoming American. The Jewish contribution to baseball history went far beyond batting averages or stolen bases. We didn't just play the game, we changed the game! For generations of American Jews and other minorities, ball players served as athletic, cultural, and ethical role models. This groundbreaking new exhibition highlights these game changers and-just as

importantly-the fans, ideals, and culture they inspired. It will be on view through October 26, 2014.

At the Yiddish Book Center a lively world of Jewish culture in Amherst, MA, there are a number of things for you to explore including a wonderful exhibit entitled Sholem Bayes ("Peace in the Home"). The American Jewish home is captured in this imaginative installation using sounds and



images culled from prose and poetry, autobiography and memoir, song and cinema. If you can go the weekend of July 17-20, you will also be able to enjoy Yidstock 2014: the Festival of New Yiddish Music. There will be klezmer band concerts, workshops and lectures.

I am a woman who demands perfection in myself, but even more, expects it. While over-analyzing my less than stellar moments, the focus cannot be upon perfection.

I'll admit it, I was the high school girl who had to get A's, who knew what I wanted to do at the age of 13 and made that a reality — including nine years of higher education — without a moment's pause. This does not mean that I have it all together. Hardly. Yet, the voice I hear in my head is too often the voice telling me when I am wrong and constantly reminding me when I can do better.

I do not want that to be the only voice my children hear.

One of the questions I am rarely asked as a rabbi, but I should be asked all of the time is, "What is your view of God?" My answer to this question is intricately bound up in my greater view of parenting. God is the divine spark in each of us that makes us unique, that makes us who we are. We all have godly gifts; and when we bring those gifts out into the world, we are bringing God into the world. As a parent, each of our children is clearly unique. Our role is to help our kids find those divine sparks within them and assist them in nurturing those strengths, so that they too can share their sparks with the world.

When I am obsessing about the activities my child does or does not do, what I have or have not taught him yet, what he should be doing at a certain age or by a certain time, I can only hear that voice of perfection. I worry that in these moments that is all my children can hear as well.

And so, I strive not to be perfect in all that I do as a mom or expect my children to be perfect in all that they are. Instead, I strive to continue to see within them the divine sparks that make them exactly who they should be.

But, I guess that is perfection after all.

I look forward to working with all of you in carrying out the goal of bringing "Audacious Hospitality" into all of our homes.



Temple Chaverim's Lone Soldier, Rachel Bressner



Greetings from Israel! In June 2013, I moved to Israel and made Aliyah, which means I am now a citizen of both the United States and Israel. I spent my first few months in Ulpan where I spent my days learning Hebrew. This was one of the

great challenges since I have been here. I can't say I am completely fluent yet, but I passed my Hebrew tests and was accepted into the **IDF**, **the Israel Defense Forces.** I am now a **Lone Soldier**, a soldier who is in the country without any immediate family.

My first few months of **IDF** service were spent in basic training. It was hard, but I passed and am now in training for my official national service as a police officer for the Israeli Police. My training includes how to handle and shoot my pistol and rifle, learning Israeli laws, and simulation of every-day emergency situations. When I am not in training, I am on duty and stationed in Hebron. Another challenge has been the transition from being a civilian to being a police officer. As a police officer, I need to be in control and remain calm in all situations. My training will be completed in August. From then on, I will continue as a police officer through my service period which ends December 2015.



I miss my family and friends in the United States, but I am happy to be a part of the protection of Israel. I am grateful to everyone for the letters and packages keeping me connected to home. I will continue to keep you updated on my progress and service.
