

#### **Make Some Noise!**

On **Purim**, we read the **Scroll of Esther**. It tells the story of how the evil Haman cast "lots" or, in Hebrew, Purim to determine the day on which the Jews of Shushan, the ancient capital of Persia, would be killed. Through the courage and cleverness of Esther and her Uncle Mordecai, the heroes of the story, a reversal took place and it was Haman who was defeated instead!

The word "Purim" appears five times in the Scroll of Esther. This corresponds to the five things we do on this day: we read the Scroll of Esther, send gifts of food to friends, send gifts to the poor, party like royalty, and avoid fasting.

Reading the Scroll of Esther is not a passive experience! Many people come dressed in costume and, of course, cheer for Esther and Mordecai. But the most important part of our observance is that everyone in attend-

ance makes lots of noise when Haman's name is read aloud.

We use a grogger to drown out Haman. Grogger is a Yiddish word meaning "rattle." The traditional grogger, which dates back to the 13th century, is a percussion instrument known as a Ratchet. It has a gear wheel and a flat board attached to a handle, like the one I am holding in the picture. The player holds the handle and swings the instrument around so that the flat board clicks against the gear wheel making a rattling noise.



Today there are various types of groggers, from simple plastic to ornate metal. At our synagogue, we encourage Purim celebrants to bring a box of pasta or dried beans to use as noise makers. We will be collecting these "groggers" and donating them to the Jewish Communal Food Pantry at the Mid-Island Y JCC. In this way, we fulfill two mitzvot: hearing the Scroll of Esther and sending gifts to the poor.

Using a grogger is one of the most profound parts of Purim and also something that we can relate to in our lives today. Haman was an enemy from ancient times, but today there are still Hamans in our world! Throughout the ages we have encountered evil many times. When we come together on Purim as one community and drown out Haman's name, we are saying that **good can be louder than evil.** We are acknowledging that there is always some-

thing we can do to overcome evil. We can be "louder and stronger."

It is so easy to become discouraged and cynical today. Purim reminds us that, working together, we can make the world a better place. We can be like Esther and Mordecai—relentless and determined to fight against evil. We can work together to be louder. So, make some noise" this Purim!

It is springtime, and we are commanded: "Nich'nas Adar!" or rejoice in the month of Adar! Certainly we can easily follow the suggestion and be happy that very soon the warmer weather will yield fresh growth and ease along the impending barley harvest at Passover time. However, because Purim occurs following the death of Haman, someone who would do us harm, it has always raised the question of how we can celebrate a death.



There are other issues with the holiday of Purim stemming from the lateness in which the Scroll of Esther was canonized into the Bible and the abrupt way that Esther's story fades away once Mordechai's status is strenathened. Additionally. the name of God is never mentioned in the scroll, so it

increases the mystery surrounding the reason this became a part of our Bible.

One of the responses to "Where is God in Purim," and where are we able to find and make joy, is in the use of music. Following the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 C.E., there was a prohibition against playing instruments or enjoying music in the worship service. There were two exceptions to this ruling -Simchat Torah and Purim. By adding music, we are able to bring in a stronger presence of God.

There are two prevailing traditions when chanting the Megillah. One is to chant in a hurried fashion, with several allusions to other holidays at key points throughout the chanting. An example of this would be to switch to the melody for the chanting of Eicha or "Lamentations" -- usually reserved for the holiday of Tisha B'Av -at key verses where there is great suffering.

The other tradition is to interject humorous melodies at lighter moments in the text, such as making fun of the Hebrew for Shushan, the Capital City, which is 'Shushan Ha'bira' (sounds like "Shushan Beer") and to chant pretending that one is drunk.

Many of the melodies are Israeli authored; and in some strange twist of fate, the Israelis have taken modern American popular melodies and created Purim parodies.

Sukkot was especially fun. They made edible sukkahs and decorations for our Temple sukkah that they got to hang up in the sukkah. They got a close-up look at the etrog and a chance to shake the lulay. They learned about Shabbat by creating their own challah covers for their Shabbat kits that they took home to use with their families.

Just when they finished up the fall holidays and Shabbat, it was time to learn about Chanukah! Everyone made hand-print meno-

rahs and developed various techniques for spinning a dreidel. You can watch our little dreidelers spinning their hearts in a video posted on our Temple Chaverim Facebook page!

Music is also an important part of our kindergarten and first-grade class! Every week Cantor Hyman sings with the class. They love it! Thanks to the fun songs the Cantor chooses, our students are quite often laughing and giggling as they sing along with him.

Princess Diana. Hear about her devotion to her children and her charities.






