**INSTRUCTION SHEET FOR COMPLETING HIGH HOLY DAYS ORDER FORM  
(MULTI-PART FORM enclosed)**

Please return the enclosed HIGH HOLY DAYS ORDER FORM (the MULTI-PART FORM) to the Temple. Please return this form no later than August 27, 2021 to timely process your requests.

**1. MEMBER TICKETS: to be completed by all members desiring High Holy Days Tickets.**

- No person will be admitted to services without a ticket.
- Each individual (adults and children under the age of 30) living in a household may be entitled to a High Holy Days ticket. In **Section 1** of the **MULTI-PART FORM**, please list all members of your household family, as well as the ages and grades of your children.
- In order for your High Holy Days ticket order to be processed, we remind you that your **account must be current**. If you have met your financial obligations and have no children in Religious School, your tickets can be picked up. To pick up your tickets or if you need last minute extra tickets, they will be available for pick up on the following dates and times:  
*Thurs., Aug. 26<sup>st</sup> (10am-4pm), Tues., Aug. 31<sup>st</sup> (10am-4pm), Wed., Sept. 1<sup>th</sup> (10am – 4pm and 6-7:30pm),  
Thurs., Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> (10am-4pm & 6-7:30pm)*

**2. FAMILY GUEST TICKETS: to be completed by members desiring tickets for non-household family member guests**

- Family members who belong to other URJ (*Union for Reform Judaism*) congregations may request courtesy tickets at our Temple by having their home congregation mail or fax a *High Holy Days Courtesy Request Form* to the Temple office (516-692-0208).
- For unaffiliated, non-household family members, **THERE IS A LIMIT OF 6 (FAMILY) MEMBER GUEST TICKETS PER MEMBER FAMILY** (The first 2 @ \$150 each, the next 4 @ \$250 each). Non-member guest tickets are \$600 each.
- In **Section 2** of the **MULTI-PART FORM**, indicate the number of tickets you are ordering and print the name, relationship and address of each non-household family member for whom a ticket is ordered.

**3. BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE: to be completed by members honoring departed loved ones in our Book of Remembrance**

- It is traditional during the High Holy Days to bring the memory of our Jewish ancestors forward into the present. It is also traditional at this time to bring to the forefront of our memory those departed loved ones from our own personal past, inscribing their names in a Book of Remembrance. This book will be distributed during the Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur.
- For your convenience, your loved ones who are known to our Temple are listed on the **Book of Remembrance Yahrzeit Letter**, which is enclosed in this packet. Please circle your loved ones' names whom you wish to honor in the Book of Remembrance and **return the Yahrzeit Letter to the office with your order form**.
- If you purchased a Memorial Plaque from July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021, inclusion in this year's Book of Remembrance is **FREE**.
- Please print the names of any additional loved ones whose memory you desire to honor in the space provided in **Section 3** of the **MULTI-PART FORM**.
- The cost for the first three (3) names into this book is **\$36 PER NAME**. Each additional name (after the first 3 names) is **\$18 PER NAME**.

- 4. FAMILY SERVICE INFORMATION: Parents are welcome to attend with their children.  
Rosh Hashanah, Tuesday, Sept. 7 / Yom Kippur, Thursday, Sept. 16 @ 9:30 AM (school age children).  
Please complete the registration form on our website.**

- 5. YOUNG FAMILY SERVICE (children under 6 years of age): Parents are welcome to attend with their children.  
Rosh Hashanah, Tuesday, Sept. 7 @ 1:00PM / Yom Kippur, Thursday, Sept. 16 @ 2:00PM.  
This service is open to the community. Pre-registration on our website is required.**

## SECURITY

**A TICKET AND PHOTO I.D. ARE REQUIRED TO ENTER THE BUILDING.** Each individual (adults and children, members and non-members) will need to show his/her High Holy Days ticket for admission to the building.

## DECORUM / DRESS / WEARING OF TALLIT

As the Sanctuary is a place of prayer and meditation, we ask that families respect the spirituality and dignity at all times by refraining from activities that can be disruptive to those worshipping including **conversation, eating, gum chewing, playing video games, text messaging and excessive walking in/out of the sanctuary** during services. Families are responsible for their children's decorum throughout the services (and in all parts of the building and grounds). We remind you that **smoking is not permitted anywhere on Temple Chaverim property**. Please **silence** cell phones and pagers in the building.

To reflect the sanctity of the occasion, we are asking that men, women, boys and girls wear appropriate clothing. Items not considered appropriate are: jeans, shoulder and/or stomach baring tops, mini-skirts, t-shirts, shorts, flip-flops and other types of casual garments. The ritual garment known as the *Tallit* is worn at morning services and at the Kol Nidre Service as a reminder to observe all God's laws and, thereby, achieve holiness. The source of the commandment to wear a Tallit is Biblical. In numbers 15:37, God says to Moses, "*Speak to the children of Israel and bid them to affix fringes to the corners of their garments.*" The Tallit was created to serve as an outer garment on which the fringes could be hung. Individuals worshipping with us who wish to wear a Tallit during services for the Holy Days are encouraged to do so. You are encouraged to bring your own, however, we have a supply outside of the Sanctuary for your use.

## FASTING ON YOM KIPPUR

**If you are ill or taking medication during the High Holy Days**, please do not refrain from taking any regular medication, even if the medication must be taken with food. If you are fasting and you feel ill, Jewish law permits you to cease fasting. Juice and crackers are available by request. If you require any other attention please notify an usher or staff member who will help you.

## PARKING

Due to the limited number of parking spaces available, please limit cars to one per family or try to carpool. For safety reasons, please avoid parking on Washington Avenue. For the High Holy Days this year, our neighbors at St. Margaret's Church are permitting our worshippers to park in their parking lot, unless there is a funeral at the church. Be a respectful neighbor and **DO NOT PARK ON LAWN AREAS** or in restricted areas or in any manner that may cause our friends at St. Margaret's to regret their kindness.

## CHILDCARE

If you require childcare (Ages 3 – 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade) on Rosh Hashanah (Tuesday, Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>) and Yom Kippur (Thursday, Sept. 16<sup>th</sup>), please visit our website to complete registration for child care. All children must be registered by August 27<sup>th</sup>.

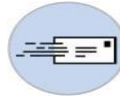
